CHINESE LANGUAGE

Mother Tongue Fortnight provided students with meaningful opportunities to appreciate Chinese language and culture. Students also recited rhythmic pieces using traditional bamboo clappers, deepening their understanding of festive traditions through hands-on experiences and expressive performances.



MALAY LANGUAGE

During Mother Tongue Fortnight 2025, students immersed themselves in the Malay language and culture through hands-on experiences beyond the classroom. From traditional games like Lereng and Batu Seremban to art forms such as Dikir Barat, Tarian and Kompang, students engaged meaningfully with their Mother Tongue. These vibrant cultural booths, including Silat, brought the richness of Malay heritage to life, deepening students' appreciation of Malay as a living language.



TAMIL LANGUAGE

As part of Mother Tongue Fortnight, students took part in exciting Tamil activities that deepened their language skills and cultural pride. They enjoyed hands-on experiences such as Agalvilaku (lamp) making, Thoranam tying and pot painting. Traditional games like Kabaddi and Aadu Puli Aatam brought much joy, while Bommalattam (puppetry) sparked their creativity. These authentic activities helped students connect meaningfully with the Tamil language and its rich cultural heritage.

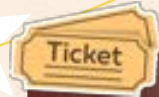
P5 Camp
