Dear Parents/Guardians,

Punctuality for School

To instil good values and habits, all students are expected to be punctual for school. Students are required to be present in the hall/classroom for the school's flag-raising ceremony at 7.50am, and any arrival after this time will be considered late. Instances of lateness will be recorded and may impact the student's overall conduct grade. Appropriate consequences will be meted out to students who are persistently late.

We appreciate your support in helping your child develop the important life skill of punctuality.

Safety of Students

If you are held up or are late in picking up your child, please remind your child to go to our General Office to seek help. We have also informed our Tampinesians that they should proceed to the General Office if they do not see their parents or caregivers after 10 minutes of waiting at the respective school gates. Please remind your child that he/she should not leave the school premises and loiter in the neighbouring areas outside the school.

We have observed several unsafe practices during afternoon dismissal that require immediate attention. Some parents and family members have been bringing children onto the roadside outside the pedestrian fencing at Gate 1 to bypass the crowded footpath. This poses a significant safety risk to the children and undermines the importance of modelling responsible road behaviour.

Parents and caregivers are reminded to remain strictly within the designated pedestrian areas when picking up their child. Please refrain from waiting along the roadside, standing outside the fencing, or lingering at the gate and along the footpath after dismissal. We seek your cooperation in moving off promptly once your child has been picked up to ease congestion.

Keeping the footpath clear, particularly during wet weather when surfaces may be slippery is critical to ensuring the safety and smooth movement of all students and families. We appreciate your cooperation to help us maintain a safe and orderly dismissal environment for everyone.

Only one parent/guardian is required to make the declaration. You can continue to submit the travel declarations after the date if there are new or amended travel plans. If there is a change in travel plan(s) after declaration, please submit a new travel declaration via PG.

If your child/ward is **not travelling** during the holidays, **no action is required**.
