Dear Parents/Guardians,

We warmly welcome our students back to school and look forward to a fruitful and enriching term ahead with the many programmes we have lined up for them.

Temperature Taking Exercise (TTEEx) on Wednesday, 1st April 2026

This exercise will help us keep the school safe and opened for learning. There will be a pre-trial on Tuesday, 31st March 2026 before the actual exercise on Wednesday, 1st April 2026. Do help your children prepare for the exercise by reminding them to bring their Oral Digital Thermometers (ODTs) to school on both days.

Our school issued the P1 students with an ODT each in January and parents do not have to buy them. The form teachers will be keeping the ODTs for all P1 students in class. For P2 to P6 students, parents are to purchase a new ODT if it is lost or damaged. ODTs can be purchased from the school's bookshop.

Mother Tongue Language (MTL) Fortnight

We are organising Mother Tongue Language Fortnight (MTL Fortnight) from Monday, 13th April to Friday, 24th April 2026 during school hours. The objective of the MTL Fortnight is to provide interactive platforms for our students to actively learn their Mother Tongue Languages and cultures to experience MTLs as "Living Languages". During this period, a variety of activities will be organised to boost your child's interest in his/her MTL.

Seasonal High Temperatures from March to May

Based on heat stress data from the National Environment Agency (NEA), measured using the Wet-Bulb Globe Temperature (WBGT), Singapore typically experiences higher temperatures during the months of March to May. Students have been instructed to drink more water and to inform their teachers immediately if they feel unwell during school activities. Parents may also wish to apply sunscreen on their children before they come to school to protect them from the heat. 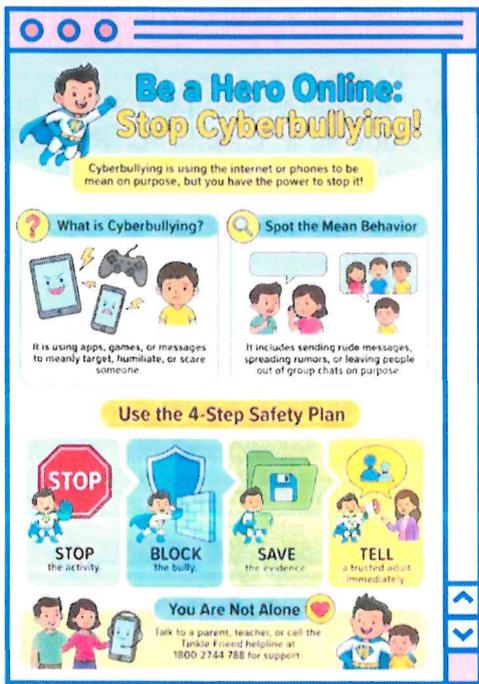

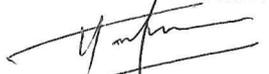
